Barren is a remote island, about 135 km from Port Blair. This isolated island in the middle of the ocean hosts the only active volcano in South Asia. While the island itself is interesting with the volcano consistently blowing ash & smoke, black sand beaches and mysterious population of wild goats (nobody knows how

these goats came to be on the island, but the speculation is that the British had left them there and somehow they have adapted to surviving on salt water) – the main attraction is the absolutely stunning diving in the waters surrounding this remote island.

This remote, uninhabited island, far from other islands, is accessible only via a live-aboard. Hence until now it was nearly impossible to experience the legendary diving here, but now India's pioneering live-aboard superyacht the *Infiniti Live-aboard* has confirmed schedules for taking divers on this amazing adventure to this remote volcano. Owing to the remoteness of the island & the topography, trips to Barren Island can only be undertaken for a short period between February to April. The *Infiniti* has announced confirmed trips between these months, ranging from 5 nights to 9 nights. Divers & travellers from around the world such as USA, France, Spain, Slovenia, Italy, Russia, UAE, Qatar & of course India have already made confirmed bookings for these trips.






Introduction to the Andaman Islands & diving here:



The Andaman Islands, among the most remote islands in the world, are a relaxed tropical island outpost belonging to India. In sharp contrast to the otherwise crowded Indian destinations, the Andaman Islands are a serene paradise for travellers. 
